CHAP. 405.**Chapter 405.**

Resolve abating a portion of the state tax of eighteen hundred fifty-one to the town of Bucksport and assessing the same on the town of Orrington.

Bucksport,
tax of 1851
abated.

Assessed on
the town of
Orrington.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be, and he hereby is directed, to abate on the state tax of the town of Bucksport for the year eighteen hundred fifty-one, the sum of twenty-three dollars and thirty-nine cents, and also to issue his warrant in due form of law to the assessors of the town of Orrington, requiring them to assess the same sum upon the polls and estates of the inhabitants of Orrington; that being the portion of the state tax for eighteen hundred fifty-one, erroneously assessed to the town of Bucksport, upon estates to the amount of eleven thousand six hundred ninety-five dollars, which had been set off from Bucksport to Orrington and not corrected in the state valuation.

Chapter 406.

Resolve in favor of David N. B. Coffin, junior.

Amount for
labor remitted.

Resolved, That there be remitted to David N. B. Coffin, junior, the amount of road labor due the state for lots number thirty-three and thirty-five, in township number four in the fifth range, west from the east line of the state, and that the land agent be authorized to convey to him, his heirs and assigns, the two lots of land aforesaid.

Chapter 407.

Resolve in favor of the town of Springfield.

Sale of certain
lands.

Proceeds, how
applied.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to sell, at such prices as he may deem just and equitable, the lands in the town of Springfield, belonging to this state and the proceeds derived from the sales of such lands to be applied to repairing roads in said town under the direction of said agent.
