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CHAP. 417.**Chapter 417.**

Resolve authorizing the sale of lot number twelve in township letter D, in first range west from east line of the state.

Land agent  
authorized to  
sell land.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to advertise and sell at public auction the interest which this state has in lot number twelve in township letter D, in the first range west from the east line of the state, having due regard to any equitable or possessory claims that any person may have thereon.

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**Chapter 418.**

Resolve to correct the state valuation.

Valuation of  
Poland and  
Danville  
regulated.

*Resolved*, That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars for estate and sixteen polls be deducted from the valuation of the town of Poland and added to the town of Danville so that the state valuation of Poland shall stand three hundred eighteen thousand, one hundred sixty-eight dollars for estate, and three hundred fifty-nine polls, and the state valuation of Danville shall stand three hundred twenty-three thousand seven hundred fifteen dollars for estate, and two hundred ninety-nine polls.

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**Chapter 419.**

Resolve in favor of William Poor, junior.

Pension.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to William Poor, junior, of Brownfield, the sum of four dollars per month, for the term of two years, commencing the first day of June, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-one, it being for injuries received in the Aroostook expedition.
