Chapter 420.

CHAP. 420.

Resolve for the repair of the road through number eleven.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to expend a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, in making such repairs as he may deem necessary, upon the roads in township number eleven, in the first range of townships, west from the east line of the state.

Chapter 421.

Resolve correcting the state valuation on certain wild lands in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That hereafter the valuation of township number thirty-six, middle division, in the county of Washington, shall be forty thousand dollars; of township number forty-two, middle division, shall be thirty-eight thousand dollars; of township number thirty, middle division, shall be twenty-four thousand dollars, instead of the several sums, at which said townships are valued in the resolve establishing a valuation for the State of Maine, approved August twenty-eight, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

Chapter 422.

Resolve requiring the publication of a list of fish inspectors.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be and hereby is required, annually, to publish a list of the inspectors of fish in this state, together with the number of tierces, barrels, half barrels, and boxes, returned by each inspector, and it shall be the duty of the secretary of state to designate those who have not made returns agreeably to law.
