CHAP. 423.**Chapter 423.**

Resolve correcting the valuation of Hallowell.

Valuation of
Hallowell
established.

Resolved, That the valuation of the city of Hallowell, in the county of Kennebec, before the incorporation of the town of Farmingdale and including that portion of said town taken from said city, is hereby fixed at nine hundred and sixty-seven thousand and forty-two dollars instead of the sum named in an act passed May twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred fifty-one.

Chapter 424.

Resolve for mounting the cannon in Calais gun-house.

Resolved, That the adjutant general be directed to appropriate the unexpended balance of fund, provided for repair of the Calais gun-house, to mounting the cannon now in the custody of mayor of Calais.

Chapter 425.

Resolve to amend the state valuation for the county of Hancock.

Valuation of
Hancock co.
reduced.

Resolved, That the resolve establishing the valuation for the State of Maine, passed August twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred and fifty, be amended by striking out of the valuation of the county of Hancock, Holbrook island and Old Harbor island, together with the valuation of each, and that the aggregate valuation of said county be four millions nine hundred and thirteen thousand and sixty-three dollars instead of the amount now fixed by law.
