CHAP. 443.**Chapter 443.**

Resolve in favor of Isaac P. Haynes.

Land  
conveyed.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to Isaac P. Haynes, lot numbered thirty-three in the town of Passadumkeag; *provided*, that said lot has not been heretofore conveyed by the state.

**Chapter 444.**

Resolve in favor of Isaiah Leavitt.

Pay for trans-  
portation of  
ordnance.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Isaiah Leavitt the sum of thirty dollars and ninety-five cents, being for expenses incurred by him for the transportation of artillery ordnance from Portland to Turner.

**Chapter 445.**

Resolve in favor of the town of Patten.

furnished.

*Resolved*, That the librarian be, and he is hereby directed, to furnish the town of Patten, the fifth and sixth volumes of the Maine Reports, neither of which volumes having been received by said town, *provided* the same are in the state library.

**Chapter 446.**

Resolve in favor of East Maine Conference.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to the trustees of East Maine Conference Seminary, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars.
