Chapter 473.

Resolve to correct error in account allowed city of Calais.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to retain the amount of one hundred and twenty-four dollars erroneously allowed the city of Calais in June last, for bounty on animals, the same having been undrawn.

Chapter 474.

Resolve in favor of John Hibbard.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to examine, or appoint some person to examine the claim of John Curtis of Perry, to a lot of land in the town of Perry, which was sold by Peter Avery agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians to John Hibbard of Perry by virtue of a resolve approved August fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, authorizing the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, to sell the same, and if said claim of John Curtis is found just, to settle with said Curtis or said John Hibbard and clear the state from any liabilities on the deed of warrantee from said agent to said Hibbard.

Claim adjusted and settled.

Chapter 475.

Resolve making an appropriation for the repair of the road from township letter F in the second range to township number eleven in the fifth range in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he hereby is authorized to expend the sum of one thousand dollars upon the road

\$1,000, repair of road.

CHAP. 476. leading from township letter F in the second range to the Aroostook road in township number eleven in the fifth range west from the east line of the state in the county of Aroostook.
