CHAP. 477.**Chapter 477.**

Resolve in favor of Seward Ham.

Compensation
for injuries
sustained.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of state the sum of ten dollars to Seward Ham, a member of the house of representatives, during the session of eighteen hundred and fifty, being for expenses by reason of injuries received while attending the remains of Daniel Ring, who was also a member of the house of representatives for the same session till his decease. The resolve in favor of Leonard Ham, approved August twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and fifty, is hereby repealed. This resolve shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Resolve in favor of certain persons of the legislature who visited the state prison.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state, the following sums, viz: to James Lancaster, six dollars and seventy-five cents; William Hopkins, six dollars and seventy-five cents; John B. Wildes, six dollars and seventy-five cents; James B. Beedle, six dollars and seventy-five cents; members of the legislature appointed to visit the state prison agreeable to an order passed February fifth, eighteen hundred and fifty-two.

Resolve in favor of certain persons.

Publication of
judiciary act,
payment of.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of this state to each of the publishers of newspapers, who shall publish, by direction of the secretary of state, the acts concerning the supreme judicial court and its jurisdiction, the sum of ten dollars in full for publishing said act.
