**Chapter 1.**

An act to change the time of holding the sessions of the supreme judicial court in the county of Somerset.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The supreme judicial court shall be holden on the third Tuesdays of March, September and December annually, at Norridgewock, within and for the county of Somerset, instead of the several times now prescribed by section fifteenth of "an act concerning the supreme judicial court and its jurisdiction," approved April nine, eighteen hundred and fifty-two.

Time of holding S. J. court for trial of jury cases.

SECT. 2. All matters and things returnable to, and which would but for the provisions of this act, have day at the term of this court, provided to be held on the first Tuesday of April, A. D. eighteen hundred and fifty-three by former statute, shall be returnable to, and have day, on the term of this court to be held on the third Tuesday of March, A. D. eighteen hundred and fifty-three.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
