KENDUSKEAG PLANK ROAD CO .- UNIVERSALIST PARISH, BATH.

Снар. 35.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved March 4, 1853.]

#### Chapter 35.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Kenduskeag Plank Road Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Capital stock increased. SECT. 1. The president, directors and company, of the Kenduskeag Plank Road Company, in the county of Penobscot, are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said company, by adding thereto the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and a certificate of the same, signed by the president and secretary of said company, shall, within ninety days from the passage of this act, be filed for record in the office of the register of deeds for the county of Penobscot.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 36.

An act to incorporate the Proprietors of the Universalist Meetinghouse in Bath, into a parish.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Nelson B. West, Benjamin Small, Davis Hatch, and the other proprietors of the Universalist Meetinghouse in Bath, and of the land thereto belonging, are hereby incorporated into a parish, and, as such, are invested with all the powers and privileges conferred by the eighteenth chapter of the revised statutes on parishes incorporated in pursuance of the provisions contained in said chapter.
