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## CHAP. 54.

Corporate  
name.

and assigns, are hereby created a coporation by the name of the Calais Iron Company, with the powers and privileges, and subject to the duties and requirements, incident to similar corporations.

Objects of  
corporation.

SECT. 2. The corporation is authorized to carry on, in Calais, the business of founding and finishing iron, and the manufacture of lumber or meal, or any other articles, and to operate for any purpose to which the power of a stationary steam engine is usually applied; and may buy, hold and possess estates real and personal, to an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

May hold real

SECT. 3. This act to go into effect from and after its approval by the governor.

## Chapter 54.

An act to incorporate the Mount Waldo Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. Robert Treat, N. H. Hubbard, Amos Sproul, Lathley Rich, Otis Kaler, Nathaniel Atwood, D. Williams, A. L. Dennison, W. R. W. Arey, William S. Smith, James Haley, James Emory, Eliphalet Greely, William Homes, second, E. G. Grant, William Treat, Amos B. Treat, George Dunham, Webster Treat, Jonathan Treat, John Atwood, C. P. Rich, James Arey and Son, Daniel Robinson, C. H. Pierce, Lyman Wiswell, Edward Fernald, James B. Little, T. Cushing, Benjamin B. Cushing, G. B. Cushing, J. C. Moore, Joseph Clark, Isaiah Rich, G. W. Rich, R. A. Rich, S. H. Folsom, John Stokell, Charles Campbell, Upton Treat, George W. Parker, T. P. Perkins, and their associates, successors and assigns, be and hereby are incorporated into a company by the name of the Mount Waldo Bank.

Capital stock.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; said bank to be located at Frankfort, in the county of Waldo.

Powers,  
liabilities, &c.

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor. CHAP. 55.

### Chapter 55.

An act to set off a part of Bremen and annex the same to the town of Waldoborough.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The following described tract of land is hereby set off from the town of Bremen, in the county of Lincoln, and annexed to the town of Waldoborough, in said county, namely: beginning at "Duck Puddle pond" on the division line of the towns of Bremen and Waldoborough, at the northwest corner of said Bremen, thence running south forty-two degrees east on said division line to land of the heirs of David Wellman, deceased, thence running westerly on the line between said Wellman's land and land of Isaac Genthner to the pond aforesaid, thence running northerly by said pond, or "Duck Puddle brook," to the place begun at.

### Chapter 56.

An act to annex a part of the town of Vienna to the town of Mount Vernon.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. That the following described territory in the town of Vienna, in the county of Kennebec, to wit: the east half of lots numbered twenty-two and twenty-three, are hereby annexed to the town of Mount Vernon.
