debtors to jail in either of the counties of Penobscot or Somerset, in the same manner and with as ample authorization as like officers in said counties of Penobscot and Somerset are by law authorized and required to do, and the keepers of the jails in said counties are hereby authorized and required to receive and detain in their custody, all such prisoners and debtors; *provided, however*, that the county of Piscataquis shall be liable to the counties of Penobscot and Somerset for all expenses and damages which shall accrue from any or all such commitments.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the fourteenth day of July next.

Chapter 60.

An act to incorporate the Cutts Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Amos H. Boyd, Daniel E. Somes, Louis O. Cowan, Abraham Cutter, Nathaniel M. Towle, and John C. Bradbury, their associates and successors and assigns, are hereby constituted and made a body politic by the name of the Cutts Manufacturing Company, and by that name may sue and be sued, have a common seal, and alter the same at pleasure, and generally to enjoy all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the duties and liabilities provided in the laws of this state regulating manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be two hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into shares, not exceeding one hundred dollars each; and said company are hereby authorized to carry on, at any place within the limits of either or both of the towns of Saco and Biddeford, the manufacture of paper, and of articles of wood, iron, steel or any other materials, the manufacture of which is not prohibited by the laws of the state; and for the purpose of carrying on their operations are authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding in value, at any one time, the amount of the capital stock as stated in the second section of this act; and the same may lease, sell or improve as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do.

CHAP. 61.First meeting,
how called, &c.

SECT. 3. Any two of the persons named in this act, may call the first meeting of this company, by publishing a notice of the time and place of said meeting, in one paper published in Saco, and one published in Biddeford, seven days prior to the holding of said meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 61.

An act additional to an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Richmond Bank."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Time

That the time for the paying in of the capital stock of said bank be extended until the first day of October next.

Chapter 62.

An act to incorporate the Ferry Point Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Joseph Granger, James Perkins, Daniel K. Chase, and Joshua Veasey, their associates and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Ferry Point Manufacturing Company, with the powers and privileges and subject to the duties and requirements incident to manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2. The corporation is authorized to carry on, at Ferry Point, in the city of Calais, the manufacture of lumber, paper, grain, gypsum and salt, and to operate for all the purposes to which water power is usually applied; and may hold and manage estates, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
