CHAP. 61.

First meeting, how called, &c.

SECT. 3. Any two of the persons named in this act, may call the first meeting of this company, by publishing a notice of the time and place of said meeting, in one paper published in Saco, and one published in Biddeford, seven days prior to the holding of said meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 61.

An act additional to an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Richmond Bank."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Time extended. That the time for the paying in of the capital stock of said bank be extended until the first day of October next.

Chapter 62.

An act to incorporate the Ferry Point Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Joseph Granger, James Perkins, Daniel K. Chase,

Corporators.

Corporate name.
Powers, privileges, &c.

and Joshua Veasey, their associates and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Ferry Point Manufacturing Company, with the powers and privileges and subject to the duties and requirements incident to manufacturing corpo-

rations.

Objects of corporation.

May hold real and personal estate. SECT. 2. The corporation is authorized to carry on, at Ferry Point, in the city of Calais, the manufacture of lumber, paper, grain, gypsum and salt, and to operate for all the purposes to which water power is usually applied; and may hold and manage estates, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
