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**Chapter 63.**

An act respecting school district number five, in Calais.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The inhabitants of school district number five, in Calais, are hereby authorized, at their annual district meeting, to raise such sum of money, in addition to their proportion of the school money raised by the city, as may be deemed necessary for the support of public schools within said district; but the amount so raised by the district in any year, shall not exceed one-half of the amount apportioned to said district from the school money raised by the city for the same year.

Authorized to raise additional school money.

Amount limited.

SECT. 2. The money so raised by the inhabitants of said district, shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as is now provided for the assessment and collection of school district taxes.

How collected.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

**Chapter 64.**

An act to incorporate the Maritime Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. Charles Cooper, A. P. Atwood, Jacob C. Smith, John Low, A. P. Guild, Albert Smith, Joseph Nickerson, Abram Woodard, Seth Paine, Hayward Peirce, William Sandford, Ichabod D. Bartlett, James Littlefield, James N. Cooper, William A. Cooper, Sidney Thaxter, Thomas Mason, Thomas N. Egery, George W. Ladd, and Nathan Pendleton, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Maritime Bank.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be seventy-five thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; said bank to be located and established in the city of Bangor, in the county of Penobscot.

Capital stock,

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

Powers, privileges, &c.
