Chapter 71.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Canal Bank, Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The president, directors and company of the Canal Bank, at Portland, are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said bank by adding thereto the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank in gold or silver on or before the first day of October next, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans may be made by such bank on such additional capital whenever the directors, or a majority of them, together with the cashier, shall have signed and certified by oath, and filed in the office of the secretary of state, a certificate that such additional capital has been actually paid in.

SECT. 2. Upon such additional capital hereby created, the said corporation shall be subject to the payment of the tax of one per cent. to the state, upon the same terms and conditions, and subject to the same liabilities provided for by the general laws of this state on the subject of banks and banking.

Chapter 72.

An act to incorporate the Sandy River Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

CHAP. 73.Corporate
name.

Leonard Keith, F. V. Stewart, Charles Church, junior, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Sandy River Bank.

Capital stock.
Shares.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and said bank shall be located at Farmington, in the county of Franklin.

Rights,

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred on such corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 73.

An act to revive the charter of the Orono Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Charter
revived.

SECT. 1. The act entitled "An act to incorporate the Orono Bank," approved February fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, is hereby revived, and the said corporators named therein are hereby authorized to organize the said corporation and to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges, subject to all the restrictions they would have and be under, if the said corporation had been legally organized within the time by law required.
