Sect. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved March 16, 1853.]

Chapter 80.

An act to incorporate the Cushnoc Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Corporate

Powers, privileges, &c.

Real and personal estate, may hold, &c.

Anthorized to manufacture articles of cotton, &c.

First meeting.

Sect. 1. James L. Child, Daniel C. Stanwood, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated by the name of the Cushnoc Manufacturing Company, with all the privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations, and are authorized to purchase, hold, improve, lease or sell real and personal estate, not exceeding at any one time in value the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, and divide the same into shares as they may deem convenient.

SECT. 2. Said company are authorized to carry on, at any town or towns, in Kennebec county, the manufacture of any article or articles of cotton, wood, wood, leather and paper, and such others as may be usefully, conveniently and necessarily connected therewith.

SECT. 3. Either of said corporators may call the first meeting of this corporation, by giving at least seven days notice to the other in writing.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 81.

An act to incorporate the Traders' Bank, of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:
