Chapter 83.

An act to set off James Wellman, with his estate, from the town of Strong, and annex the same to the town of Farmington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Territory set off.

Boundaries.

Sect. 1. So much of the farm of James Wellman as is now situated in the town of Strong, and bounded as follows: beginning at a beech tree standing on the south line of Strong, and on the range line between front and back lots (with several ancient marks thereon); thence north on said range line thirty rods to land owned by Peter W. or John Willis; thence west, on the south line of said Willis's land, about one mile, to the channel of the Sandy river; thence south down the channel of said river thirty rods, to the north line of Farmington; thence east on said line to the first mentioned bound. The above described premises, together with the buildings situated thereon, are hereby set off from Strong and annexed to the town of Farmington, in the county of Franklin.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 84.

An act to change the name of the East and South Thomaston Fire and Marine Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Name changed. The corporate name of the East and South Thomaston Fire and Marine Insurance Company, of Rockland, shall be the "Lime Rock Fire and Marine Insurance Company."
