## Chapter 108.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Expenditures  
of govern-  
ment, &c.

SECT. 1. In order to provide for certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury, the same to be in lieu of all existing appropriations whatever. And the governor with the advice and consent of the council is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-four, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.

### Chapter 109.

An act to prevent the destruction of pickerel in Long Mousom pond, Square Mousom pond, Goose pond, Upper Goose pond, Hanson pond, and Loon pond.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. If any person or persons, from and after the passage of this act, at any time in the season of the year from the first day of November to the first day of May, shall in any man-
