Chapter 109.

An act to prevent the destruction of pickerel in Long Mousom pond, Square Mousom pond, Goose pond, Upper Goose pond, Hanson pond, and Loon pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. If any person or persons, from and after the passage of this act, at any time in the season of the year from the first day of November to the first day of May, shall in any man-

CHAP. 110.

Penalty for violation of, how recovered and applied.

ner take or destroy any pickerel in Long Mousom pond, Square Mousom pond, Goose pond, Upper Goose pond, Hanson pond, and Loon pond, lying in the towns of Shapleigh and Acton, he shall forfeit and pay a fine of five dollars for each pickerel so taken or destroyed. And all fines arising from a violation of this act may be recovered by an action of debt in any court competent to try the same, one-half thereof to the use of the person who may sue for the same, the other half to the use of the town in which the offense is committed.

Chapter 110.

An act to incorporate the Calais Gas Light Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.	SECT. 1.	Noah Smith, junior, Seth W. Smith, and Charles H. Smith, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Calais Gas Light Company, and are vested with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities, by law incident to corporations of a similar nature.
Corporate name.		
Authorized to hold real and personal estate, &c.	SECT. 2.	Said corporation is authorized to hold all such real and personal estates as may be necessary and proper to enable them to carry on the manufacture of gas, for the purpose of lighting the streets, factories and all other buildings and works in the city of Calais, and to construct such reservoirs, gas-holders, gaspipes and other things as may be requisite and proper for such purpose, <i>provided</i> the whole amount of the capital stock of said company shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars.
Gasholders, &c.		
Proviso.		
Right to lay gaspipes, &c.	SECT. 3.	Said corporation shall have the right to lay gaspipes in any of the public streets or highways of said city of Calais, the consent of the authorities of said city having first therefor been obtained, and to relay and repair the same, subject to such regulations as the health and safety of the citizens and the security of the public travel may require, and as may be prescribed by the authorities aforesaid.
Authorized to relay and repair.		
City of Calais and certain manufacturing companies are authorized to take stock.	SECT. 4.	The city of Calais, or any manufacturing or machine company having its place of business in said city of Calais, may take and hold stock in said corporation not exceeding a sum the legal interest of which will pay for all gas consumed and
