used for the purpose of lighting the buildings of said companies and the buildings and streets belonging to said city of Calais.

CHAP. 111.

SECT. 5. The two persons first named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, by notice published in any newspaper printed in the city of Calais seven days at least before the day of meeting; and at such meeting by-laws may be adopted and all necessary officers chosen for managing the affairs of said corporation.

First meeting,
how called.

SECT. 6. The legislature may at any time alter, amend or repeal this act whenever in their opinion the public good may require.

SECT. 7. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 111.

An act authorizing the proprietors of the old Union meetinghouse in Vienna to sell the same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The proprietors of the old Union meetinghouse in Vienna be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to sell said house and lot in such a manner as they shall direct by a vote of a majority of said proprietors present at any legal meeting called for that purpose by virtue of this act. But previous to the sale of said house and lot, said proprietors shall cause the pews of said meetinghouse, together with the meetinghouse lot, to be appraised by three disinterested freeholders, and the proceeds of such sale shall be divided among the pew holders of said meetinghouse according to said appraisal, after deducting all necessary expenses arising from the appraisal and sale of said house and lot, *provided* the same shall be demanded within one year after said sale.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. Nathaniel Whittier, Ozem Doust, and James Porter, or either of them, be and they hereby are authorized to fix upon the time and place of holding a meeting of said proprietors, and to notify the same by posting up notices thereof in two or more public places in said Vienna, ten days at least before said meeting.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
