Chapter 17.

CHAP. 17.

Resolve in favor of Joshua Haskell, and A. S. Perkins and Company.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Joshua Haskell, and A. S. Perkins and Company, the sum of one hundred dollars for remuneration for loss sustained by the seizure of their timber by the state.

Chapter 18.

Resolve making an appropriation for the building of a bridge over the Mattawamkeag river, in the plantation of Bancroft.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to expend the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars to aid in the construction of a bridge across the Mattawamkeag river in the plantation of Bancroft; *provided*, the inhabitants and proprietors interested cause a good and substantial bridge to be built across said river to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of Alexander G. Turner.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Alexander G. Turner the sum of four dollars per month for one year, for damages received while doing military duty.

Chapter 20.

Resolve in favor of William W. Quimby.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to William W. Quimby, on account of injuries received while in the service of the state, the sum of three dollars per month for three years.
