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CHAP. 44.**Chapter 44.**

Resolve authorizing the governor and council to abate a tax on the west part of township Number Six in the county of Franklin.

Road tax,  
abatement of.

*Resolved*, That the governor and council be authorized to hear testimony and investigate the same in relation to a road tax which was assessed on the west part of township Number Six, in the county of Franklin, by the county commissioners of said county, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-seven and eighteen hundred and forty-eight, and make such abatement on said taxes as they may judge expedient; *provided, however*, that said proprietors shall first pay such proportion as the governor and council shall adjudge.

**Chapter 45.**

Resolve in favor of Joseph Nadeau.

Remuneration  
for building  
bridge.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Joseph Nadeau, the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, for erecting a bridge across Fish river.

**Chapter 46.**

Resolve in favor of William Tripp.

Remuneration  
for travel, &c.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid to William Tripp, from any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, twelve dollars, in consideration of travel and attendance as a witness on the court martial of William Nye, holden at Farmington, in the month of December, eighteen hundred and fifty-two.
