Chapter 66.

Resolve in favor of certain members of the legislature.

On account of sickness.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Joseph H. Perkins, five dollars; to Edward D. Safford, twenty dollars; to Thomas Lennox, twenty-five dollars; to Daniel Dolloff, sixty dollars, it being for expenses incurred by them on account of sickness while attending as members of the house of representatives during the present session.

Chapter 67.

Resolve in favor of Ira B. Delano.

Note, surrender of, &c.

State discharged from further liability. Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to cancel and surrender a note of hand to, signed by Ira B. Delano, for the sum of six hundred seven dollars twenty-one cents, dated December thirty-one, eighteen hundred and fifty; and the state thereby to be fully discharged for all damages sustained by the detention of logs at Kendall's Mills, in Fairfield, in eighteen hundred and fifty-one, by the agent for reserved lands in the county of Somerset.

Chapter 68.

Resolve relating to banks and banking.

Banking law, violation of, &c. Resolved, That the public interest and the permanent safety of the banks of this state require a more thorough and rigid execution of the laws than has heretofore prevailed relating to the examination of the banks by the bank commissioners and the prosecution of such as are found guilty of violations of their charters or the laws of the state, particularly where "there has been any departure by brokerage or otherwise from the ordinary business of banking associations."

Copies of this resolve to be sent to bank commissioners, &c.

Resolved, That the secretary of state communicate a copy of these resolves to each of the bank commissioners, the attorney general and to the cashiers of the several banks of this state.
