CHAP. 72.

Chapter 72.

Resolve in favor of the temporary clerks in the office of secretary of state.

Extra
compensation.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury to the several temporary clerks employed in the office of secretary of state during the session of the present legislature, the sum of two dollars per day and travel, Sundays included, from the time they entered said office until formally discharged by the secretary of state; and this resolve shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 73.

Resolve authorizing the treasurer of state to purchase the state scrip.

State scrip,
purchase of.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized to purchase at such premium as the governor and council may deem expedient, the state scrip that may fall due in eighteen hundred and fifty-five and eighteen hundred and fifty-six, as far as the state of the treasury will allow; *provided* the funds of the treasury are not required by any action of this legislature for the purchase of the lands belonging to Massachusetts, situated in this state.

Chapter 74.

Resolve to provide for the repair of the Mattawamkeag bridge, on the military road.

Bridge,
repair of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars, to be under his direction applied to the repairs of the piers and abutments of the bridge, and that when the repairs shall be made to his satisfaction, the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the payment of the sum so expended not exceeding two thousand dollars.
