CHAP. 69.

Chapter 69.

An act to increase the salary of the judge of probate for the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Judge of probate,
Hancock county,
salary \$375.

SECT. 1. The judge of probate, in and for the county of Hancock, shall be entitled to receive a salary of three hundred and seventy-five dollars, in quarterly payments, on the first day of January, April, July, and October, in each year, instead of the sum now allowed.

Judge to hold
two terms yearly
in Mt. Desert.

SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of the judge of probate to hold, in addition to the usual probate courts now holden by him, two terms yearly in the town of Mount Desert, at such times as he may designate.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

Chapter 70.

An act to establish the county of Sagadahoc.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Boundaries.

SECT. 1. The towns of Arrowsic, Bowdoin, Bowdoinham, Georgetown, Woolwich, Perkins, Phipsburg, Richmond, Topsham, West Bath and the city of Bath, all in the county of Lincoln, be and the same are hereby constituted and made a county by the name of Sagadahoc, whereof the shire town shall be as hereinafter provided; and the inhabitants of said territory shall have, possess, use and enjoy all the powers, rights and immunities, and be subject to all the duties, which by the constitution and laws of the state are granted and imposed upon the inhabitants of other counties.

SECT. 2. From and after the first day of April next there shall be held at the places hereinafter provided, within and for the county of Sagadahoc, two terms of the supreme judicial court, for the trial of civil and criminal business, which said terms of said court shall be holden on the first Tuesday of April and the third Tuesday of August; and one term of the said supreme judicial court for the trial of civil business only
