SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 281.

An act to extend the charter of Stillwater Bridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. A further time of ten years in addition to the time prescribed by the act of incorporation, is hereby granted to the proprietors of the Stillwater bridge, in Orono, to keep and maintain their bridge and to take tolls; and the rights and privileges allowed by their charter are extended for the term of ten years from and after the time when they would otherwise expire by limitation.

SECT. 2. The proprietors of said Stillwater bridge shall have power to sell and dispose of their interest in said bridge, and the real estate belonging thereto, at any time before the expiration of said term of ten years, to the town of Orono, for such sum as may be mutually agreed on by said proprietors and said town, by a committee appointed for that purpose, at a legal town meeting; and authority is hereby given to said town of Orono to buy said bridge and estate as aforesaid.
