Chapter 318.

An act to incorporate the Saco River Ice Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Edwin R. Wiggin, Joseph T. Nye, Gideon Tucker corporators. and Thomas M. Hayes, their successors, associates and assigns are hereby constituted and made a body corporate by the name of the Saco River Ice Company, for the purpose of cutting ice in Corporate name. the Saco river and streams running into said river, and vending the same, with all the privileges and powers, and subject to all Powers, duties, the duties and liabilities of similar corporations in this state.

Said corporation may purchase and hold real and May purchase and hold real and may purchase personal estate with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

Any two persons named in this act may call the First meeting. Sect. 3. first meeting for the purpose of organizing the corporation, at such time and place as they see fit, by posting up notices, in two public places in the town of Saco, seven days before the time of said meeting.

Sect. 4. Said corporators may make all necessary by-laws By-lews for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this state.

Chapter 319.

An act to incorporate the Lewiston Linen Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. George H. Dean, Marshall French and George L. Corporators Ward, their associates and successors are hereby incorporated and made a body politic by the name of the Lewiston Linen Corporate names Company for the purpose of manufacturing linen and other fabrics at Lewiston.
