CHAP. 400. missioners appointed under chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes of this state, on such terms as may be agreed upon by the parties; and also to recover to their own use, any vessels or other property that shall have been sunk and abandoned for the space of one year; *provided*, that said company shall give thirty days personal notice to the parties interested, and said parties shall not object.

May recover to their own use certain vessels.

Proviso.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved April 20, 1854.]

Chapter 400.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Appropriations.

SECT. 1. In order to provide for certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury; and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.
