Chapter 94.

Resolve authorizing the county of York to procure a loan.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the county of York, is hereby authorized to procure a loan, of a sum of money not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum, on the faith and responsibility of said county, for the purpose of discharging the liabilities of said county, in erecting fire proof buildings, for the safe keeping of the county records. The interest on said sum to be paid annually, and the principal to be reimbursed by said county at such time or times, as the county commissioners may agree upon; *provided*, the whole sum shall be paid within six years; and the said treasurer is hereby authorized to give his promissory note or notes therefor, as county treasurer for and in behalf of said county, payable in the manner aforesaid; *provided*, that no part of said sum of eighteen thousand dollars, shall be used except in discharge of liabilities already incurred, or in payment of contracts already made, until the question of the propriety of the removal of the county buildings, shall be previously heard and determined, by this legislature.
