Chapter 112.

Resolve in favor of James Lawrence, a said provided to the

Jas. Lawrence, pension granted to. Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to James Lawrence of Newport, four dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the service of the state.

Chapter 113.

Resolve in favor of Orient plantation in the county of Aroostook.

Orient plantation, in favor of. Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby directed to pay to Orient plantation in the county of Aroostook, the sum of nineteen dollars seventy-nine cents, being said plantation's proportion of the school funds, for the years eighteen hundred and fifty-two and eighteen hundred and fifty-three.
