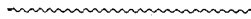
Resolve in favor of Orient plantation in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby directed to pay to Orient plantation in the county of Aroostook, the sum of nineteen dollars seventy-nine cents, being said plantation's proportion of the school funds, for the years eighteen hundred and fifty-two and eighteen hundred and fifty-three.

Resolved, That any justice of the supreme judicial court, at any court holden in the county of Washington, is hereby authorized to examine the account of Ephraim C. Gates and Giles M. Wentworth for services rendered and expenses incurred in arresting one William Elliot, who was subsequently prosecuted to conviction, and to allow to said Gates and Wentworth what may be found reasonably due for the same; and the sum so allowed shall be paid by the county treasurer of the county of Washington, and charged by him to the state.
