Chapter 111.

An act to abolish the January term of the supreme judicial court for the county of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. So much of the fifteenth section of the act approved April ninth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, entitled "An act concerning the supreme judicial court and its jurisdiction," as provides for sessions of the supreme judicial court in and for the county of Franklin, on the third Tuesdays of January, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. All matters and things returnable to, and which would but for the provisions of this act have day at the term of said court provided to be held in said county on the third Tuesday of January instant, shall be returnable to and have day at the term of said court to be held on the third Tuesday of April next.

SECT. 3. The traverse jurors drawn and notified for the next January term of said court, are hereby required to serve as traverse jurors at the term of said court to be held on the third Tuesday of April next, instead of the term hereby abolished, and that the clerk of the court issue notices to them accordingly, and that no jurors be drawn to serve at said April term.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
