#### Chapter 130.

Снар. 130.

An act additional to give mortgagees of real estate a lien on policies of assurance against

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. In any trustee action commenced by virtue of the mcompany defend, liable statute of eighteen hundred forty-four, chapter one hundred and for costs. seven, if such insurance company shall assume the defense of the same, they shall be liable to the plaintiff for all costs that may accrue in said action, in the same manner that the principal defendant would have been, if he had defended.

This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 131.

An act for the promulgation of the public laws.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Whenever any public act is signed by the governor, Public acts, approval of, to be communicated through the secretary of state, be communicated by a verbal or written message, to the house of representatives, that he has approved and signed the act, describing it by its title and the date of the approval; and the title of the act and the date \_titles, &c., to of the approval, shall be entered on the journal of the house of journals of house representatives, and that house shall transmit the same information, by a message to the senate, which shall be entered upon the journal of that house.

The secretary of State shall, as soon thereafter as may \_to be published SECT. 2. be, cause a copy of such act to be published with the date of the approval in the state paper.

This act shall take effect and be in force from and SECT. 3. after its approval by the governor.
