CHAP. 134.

Quantity of water diverted from its natural channel, how restricted.

SECT. 3. The quantity of water that may be diverted from its natural channel by such canal, as is provided for in section one of this act, shall be liable to be restricted and regulated by the verdict of a jury, or the report of commissioners, as provided in the act to which this is additional.

Improvements on streams, &c., forming the boundary of this state, regulation of.

SECT. 4. All the provisions of chapter one hundred and twentysix of the revised statutes, be and the same are hereby extended
and made applicable to any water mill and a dam to raise water for
working it, which have been or may hereafter be erected and maintained upon or across any stream or river forming the boundary
line of this state and any other state or province, notwithstanding
that a portion of the dam aforesaid, extending across said stream or
river, is or may be in such other state or province, and the rights
and remedies of all parties concerned shall be ascertained and
determined under the provisions of said chapter, in the same manner
as if the whole of said stream or river was in this state.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 134.

An act to prevent exorbitant taxation of blood animals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Blood animals, taxation of, regulated. SECT. 1. Any person who shall import into this state any blood animals, and keep the same for the improvement of stock in his vicinity, shall not be liable to any higher tax on said animals, than he would be on a good quality of stock kept for other purposes.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be enforced from and after it is signed by the governor.
