Chapter 411.

Снар. 411.

An act to allow the construction of a dike across Pidgeon Hill Marsh Creek, in the town of Milbridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Jacob F. Lewis is hereby authorized to construct a dike across Authorized to Pidgeon Hill Marsh Creek, (so called,) in the town of Milbridge.

Chapter 412.

An act in addition to an act entitled An act to incorporate the Allegesh Dam Company, approved June third, eighteen hundred fifty-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The said corporation is hereby authorized to demand and receive Authorized to a toll for the passage of logs or timber over or through their dam, or by their sluices or other improvements, of ten cents per thousand feet board measure, and ten cents per ton for all hewn timber, -rate of tolk. instead of the tolls granted in said act, subject to all the provisions. of said act.

[Approved February 1, 1855.]

Chapter 413.

An act to apportion and assess on the inhabitants of this state a tax of two hundred onethousand, one hundred fifty-three dollars, forty-four cents, for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. That each city, town, plantation or other place hereinafter named, within this state, shall be assessed and pay the several sums with which they respectively stand charged.
