CHAP. 430.

Chapter 430.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Ticonic Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Capital stock increased \$25,000.

Shares.

Loans, when made.

SECT. 1. The president, directors and company of the Ticonic Bank at Waterville, are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said bank, by adding thereto the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank, in gold or silver, on or before the fifteenth day of October next, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans may be made by said bank on said additional capital whenever the directors, or a majority of them, with the cashier of said bank, shall have signed and verified by oath, and filed with the secretary of state, a certificate that said additional capital has been actually paid in.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 431.

An act to annex certain territory to the town of Weston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Weston, town of, certain territory annexed.

SECT. 1. All that territory embraced within the following described lines, together with the inhabitants thereon, is hereby annexed to the town of Weston, in the county of Aroostook, namely: commencing at the south-westerly corner of said town of Weston, thence running southerly, in continuation of the westerly side line of said town to the county line; thence, easterly, on the county line to the state line; thence, northerly, on the easterly line of the state to a point where said state line would be intersected by a continuation of the southerly line of Orient; thence, westerly, on said continuation and southerly line of Orient to the easterly line of Weston; thence, southerly, on the easterly line of Weston to the south-easterly corner of said town; thence, westerly, on the southerly line of Weston to the place of commencement.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
