SECT. 3. All acts of the union meeting-house association which may be invalid by reason of any insufficient notice in calling the meetings of such association, are hereby ratified, confirmed, and made valid.

CHAP. 471.

Invalid acts
ratified.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from the time of its approval by the governor.

Chapter 471.

An act to incorporate the Alfred Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Daniel Goodenow, Benjamin J. Herrick, Cyrus K. Conant, John Henry Sayward, Augustus O. Clark, Timothy Shaw, junior, Edwin R. Wiggin, Israel Chadbourn, Winbern Adams, Luther S. Moore, Abner Burbank, James Otis McIntire, Sylvester Littlefield, Silas Derby, John Lewis, John N. Stimson, H. G. Herrick, Aaron Clark, junior, and Ira T. Drew, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Alfred Bank.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and said bank shall be located and established in Alfred, in the county of York.

Location.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 472.

An act accepting the surrender of the charter of the Atlantic Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The surrender of the charter of the Atlantic Bank is hereby accepted.

CHAP. 473.

Said bank to continue in its corporate capacity, &c.

To publish such surrender, &c., for six weeks.

SECT. 2. Said bank shall continue in its corporate capacity for the term of two years from the time this act shall take effect, with all the powers necessary for collecting the debts due the corporation, selling and conveying its property, and finally closing its concerns.

SECT. 3. Said bank shall publish for six weeks successively, in the state paper, and one or more papers printed in the city of Portland, a notice of the surrender of its charter, and of the time when its liability to redeem its bills will expire.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 473.

An act additional to an act incorporating the city of Biddeford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 19 of act to incorporate city of Biddeford repealed.
City marshal, appointment of.

—powers and duties.

SECT. 1. The nineteenth section of the act to which this is additional is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. The mayor and aldermen shall appoint a city marshal, in the manner provided in section fourth of the act to which this is additional, who shall have all the powers and exercise all the duties that now appertain to constables of towns, and who shall be chief of the city police, and as such may enforce such ordinances and regulations, under the direction of the mayor, as may be adopted by the city council for the government of the city of Biddeford.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Governor.

Chapter 474.

An act making further provision for the administration of police in the city of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Mayor and aldermen to appoint city marshal, &c.

SECT. 1. After the present municipal year the city marshal of the city of Portland, together with such number of deputy marshals
