Chapter 511.

An act to authorize the selectmen of the town of Wiscasset to lay out a road over tide

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Wiscasset, in the county Authorized to lay of Lincoln, are hereby authorized and empowered to lay out and road. establish a town way or road over tide waters in said town, from Bradbury street, over land of Franklin Clark and others, to the road leading to Birch Point mills, at or near Porter's corner, so called.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 512.

An act to incorporate the Maine Flax Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

John D. Lang, Thomas S. Lang, and Charles Osborn, Corporators. their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Maine Flax Company, and are authorized Corporate name. to take and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding May hold real two hundred thousand dollars, for the purposes of growing and pre-estate. paring flax for manufacture, and of manufacturing flax, wool, cotton, linseed oil, and any other articles, at one or more desirable places in the state, with a right to erect such mills, dams, machines and buildings, as may be necessary for these purposes, and shall have Powers and all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities contained in the general laws of the state relating to similar corporations.
