CHAP. 516.**Chapter 516.**

An act to increase the capital stock of the Belfast Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Capital stock in-
creased \$25,000.

—when to be
paid in.

Loans.

SECT. 1. The president, directors and company of the Belfast Bank are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said bank, by adding thereto, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank, in gold or silver, on or before the first day of October next, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans may be made by said bank on said additional capital, whenever the directors, or a majority of them, with the cashier of said bank, shall have signed and verified by oath, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State a certificate, that said additional capital has been actually paid in.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 517.

An act to change the name of the Danville Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Name changed.

From and after the passage of this act the corporation known by the name of the president, directors and company of the Danville Bank, is hereby changed to that of the president, directors and company of the Auburn Bank, Auburn.

Chapter 518.

An act to change the name of George Carll, junior.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Name changed.

SECT. 1. George Carll, junior, of Buxton, shall be allowed to take the name of George Bonney Carll. And said George Carll, junior, from and after the time at which this act shall take effect, shall be known and called by the name which he is allowed to take
