pay all state and county taxes that may be assessed upon said town CHAP. 523. previous to the next general state valuation, without any claim upon that portion set off, or any alteration in the present state valuations of the said towns of Brewer and Eddington.

SECT. 4. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 523.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Eastern Bank, Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The president, directors and company, of the Eastern Bank, Bangor, are hereby authorized to increase its capital stock by adding thereto the sum of fifty thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank, in gold or silver, on or before the first day of October next, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans may be made by said bank on said additional capital, whenever the directors, or a majority of them, with the cashier of said bank, shall have signed and verified by oath, and filed in the office of secretary of state a certificate that said additional capital has been actually paid in.

Chapter 524.

An act authorizing the selectmen of the town of Frankfort to appoint surveyors of lumber.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Frankfort shall be, and are hereby authorized and empowered to appoint a suitable number of surveyors of manufactured lumber in said town, who shall also be measurers of wood and bark, cullers of hoops and staves, and surveyors of shingles, who shall remain in office by such appointment for one year from the date thereof, or until others shall be chosen by the citizens of said town at their annual meeting in March, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, and said surveyors shall have the

Authorized to appoint surveyors of lumber.
