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**Chapter 203.**

CHAP. 203.

Resolve directing the state treasurer to balance accounts with the Washington County and St. Croix Banks.

*Resolved,* That the treasurer of state be, and he is hereby authorized to carry to the account of profit and loss, the sum of six hundred seventeen dollars, due to the state from the Washington County Bank, at the time of its failure, and the sum of one hundred ninety-five dollars and eighty-nine cents, due from the St. Croix Bank, at the time of its winding up its affairs, to balance the same.

**Chapter 204.**

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

*Resolved,* That there be paid from the state treasury, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy Indians, the sum of two hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of said agent, in aid of said Indians in their agricultural pursuits, by purchasing seed and assisting them in planting the same.

**Chapter 205.**

Resolve in favor of Luther Curtis.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the state treasury, to Luther Curtis, the sum of fifty dollars, for services and expenses in arresting Columbus Richardson, now under sentence of twenty years in the state prison.

**Chapter 206.**

Resolve in favor of Peter S. Folsom.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the state treasury to Peter S. Folsom, four dollars per month during the pleasure of the legislature for injuries received while in the service of the state.
