Chapter 217.

Resolve in favor of David W. Dinsmore.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state be and hereby is authorized to pay to David W. Dinsmore, twelve dollars and thirtyseven cents, for money paid out by him to certain witnesses whose fees could not be allowed by court.

Chapter 218.

Resolve in favor of Charles Turner.

Resolved, That twenty dollars be paid Charles Turner for his services as messenger to the board of agriculture during the recent session.

Chapter 219.

Recolve in aid of certain settlers on the Saint John River.

Resolved, That a sum, not exceeding six thousand dollars, is hereby appropriated for the relief of settlers on the Saint John River, and the governor and council are hereby authorized to draw their warrant on the treasurer for said sum, and cause the same to be expended for provision and seed, to be distributed under their direction among so many of said settlers as are in want thereof, and unable to furnish themselves.
