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CHAP. 223.**Chapter 223.**

Resolve making appropriation for chaplain and assistant physician, for the insane hospital.

Chaplain and assistant physician of insane hospital, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That there be appropriated and paid out of the state treasury one hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the trustees of the insane hospital, for services of chaplain therefor. Also, three hundred dollars to pay for the services of Jerome C. Smith, for his services as assistant physician in said hospital for one year.

**Chapter 224.**

Resolve in favor of Sumner Burnham.

Sumner Burnham, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid by the state treasurer to Sumner Burnham, the sum of two hundred dollars, for expenses and services in arresting Reuben Wiley.

**Chapter 225.**

Resolve making an appropriation for a fire-proof safe for the land office.

Safe in land office, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, for building a fire-proof safe in the land office.

**Chapter 226.**

Resolve in favor of Isaac Wilder.

Isaac Wilder, land agent authorized to convey certain lands to.

Proviso.

*Resolved,* That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to Isaac Wilder four lots of land, not exceeding one hundred and sixty acres each, in township numbered thirteen, in the third range, west from the east line of the state, whenever said township shall have been set apart and lotted for settlement; *provided,* said Wilder shall

select said lots, and return a certificate of such selection to the land agent within six months after said township shall have been so set apart and lotted. CHAP. 227.

### Chapter 227.

Resolve authorizing a cistern near the state house.

*Resolved*, That the governor, with advice of council, cause a cistern, of not exceeding five hundred hogsheads capacity, to be sunk in the rear, and within one hundred and fifty feet of the state house, and supplied with water from the roof of the same. The cistern to be built of brick and cement, and of circular form; also, to be covered with an arch of brick and cement, and the arch supported by a central column. And that the governor, with advice of council, be authorized to draw his warrant upon the state treasury to defray the expense of the same. Cistern near state house, in favor of.

### Chapter 228.

Resolve in favor of Caleb Blake.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state the sum of sixty-two dollars and seventy-three cents, to Caleb Blake, for aiding, pursuing and arresting a fugitive from justice. Caleb Blake, in favor of.

### Chapter 229.

Resolve in favor of George K. Smith.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury to George K. Smith, of Westbrook, four dollars per month, during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the service of the state. George K. Smith, pension granted to.
