CHAP. 251.

Chapter 251.

Resolve to diminish the state valuation of the town of Cutler.

Town of Cutler,
state valuation
of, diminished.

Resolved, That the state valuation of the town of Cutler, in the county of Washington, shall hereafter and until the next state valuation, be fixed at forty-three thousand dollars, instead of the sum now fixed by law.

Chapter 252.

Resolve in favor of the town of Richmond.

Town of Rich-
mond, in favor of.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be directed to furnish the town of Richmond with a copy of each volume of Maine Reports, belonging to the state, not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 253.

Resolve in relation to the purchase of the Eaton and Plymouth grants.

Preamble.

Whereas, The commissioners appointed under resolves authorizing the appointment of commissioners to locate grants and determine the extent of possessory claims, under the late treaty with Great Britain, have reported a large number of such claims in the grants to the town of Plymouth, and to General Eaton. Therefore,

Authorized to
obtain title to
certain grants.
Proviso.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to obtain the title to the whole, or any part of said grants; *provided*, the same can be obtained of the proprietors, upon reasonable terms, by an exchange of lands or otherwise, and the land agent is hereby authorized to make the necessary conveyances, when thereto directed by order of the governor and council.
