STATE OF MAINE.

1855.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to forward a copy of CHAP. 261. these resolves to each of our senators and representatives in congress.

[Approved March 16, 1855.]

Chapter 261.

Resolve setting apart certain townships for settlement.

Resolved, That the following townships be, and the same are hereby set apart for settlement, namely: townships numbered eleven, in the first range, letter B., in the first range, letter C., in the first range, letter G., in the second range, letter I., in the second range, number thirteen, in the third range, number four, in the fourth range, number twelve, in the fourth range, and number three, in the fifth range.

Certain townships set apart for settlement.

Resolved, That the land agent shall cause the above townships to be surveyed and lotted, as soon as practicable, and when so surveyed and lotted, the same shall be offered to actual settlers upon the terms and conditions of an act additional to an act, entitled an act additional to an act in relation to the public lands, approved August twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and fifty.

Resolved, That the land agent shall cause the timber on the several lots surveyed, to be estimated and returned to the land office, and no lots shall be sold to actual settlers, which the governor and council shall determine to be valuable to the state for timber, until the timber shall have been sold by the state.

Timber, duty of land agent in relation to.

Resolved, That the land agent, under the direction of the governor and council, be authorized to grant permits, annually, to individuals to cut and haul timber on any of the lands belonging to the state, in the five first ranges, west from the east line of the state, which have been or may be set apart for settlement.

Authorized to grant permits, &c., in certain townships.

Chapter 262.

Resolve for the payment of additional roll of accounts, number thirty-five.

Payment of additional roll of accounts No. 35.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury of state, not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations, respectively named in the additional roll of accounts, numbered thirty-five, the sum set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of four thousand four hundred seventy-nine dollars and ninety-one cents, in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 263.

Resolve for the encouragement of flax growing.

Flax growing, encouragement of.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars is hereby placed in the hands of the Maine State Agricultural Society, for the encouragement of the raising of flax in this state, to be appropriated in such manner as in their judgment will best subserve such purpose. And the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.
