Chapter 264.

CHAP. 264.

Resolve in favor of H. P. Osgood.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to H. P. Osgood, twenty-five dollars, it being for expenses incurred by him on account of sickness, while attending as a member of the house of representatives, during the present session.

Chapter 265.

Resolve authorizing the appointment of a commissioner to settle certain claims against the government of the United States.

Resolved, That the governor, by and with the advice of the council, be and he hereby is authorized to appoint a commissioner, whose duty it shall be, under the direction of the governor and council, to examine, prosecute, and settle all claims which the state may have upon the government of the United States, for lands set off to settlers under the fourth article of the treaty of Washington, and for all expenses incurred by this state in setting off said lands.

Commissioners to examine and settle certain claims against U. S., appointment, duties of, &c.

Chapter 266.

Resolve in favor of James Simmons.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to James Simmons lots numbered fourteen, twenty, twenty-six, nineteen, and north half of lot numbered twenty-five, in township eight, in the fifth range, west from the east line of the state, upon condition that the said Simmons performs his original agreement with the land agent, in the purchase of said lots.
