*Resolved*, That the person appointed to prosecute the survey be required to present to the governor and council, on or before the first day of January, in each year, a report of his proceedings, and of the progress of the work entrusted to him, and that the same be printed for the use of the legislature.

**Chapter 282.**

Resolve for the exchange of documents.

*Resolved*, That the secretary of state be and he is hereby authorized and required to cause exchanges to be made with the governments of Canada and New Brunswick, of all the public documents of this state, in the same manner as is effected with the several states of the Union.

**Chapter 283.**

Resolve in favor of Albert T. Wheelock.

*Resolved*, That there is hereby appropriated from the contingent fund of the state, the sum of one hundred dollars, to defray a portion of the expenses of Albert T. Wheelock of Belfast, as a reporter of matters of interest to the agricultural societies of this state, from the Paris Exhibition, to be held in Paris, France, the present year; and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer of state for the same.

**Chapter 284.**

Resolve in favor of schools on certain islands.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state, from proceeds of bank tax, to Richard Davis of Harbor Island, the sum of sixty-five dollars, for educational purposes on Harbor, Otter and Cranberry islands, in Lincoln county; and the governor, with the advice of the council, is hereby authorized to

CHAP. 285. draw his warrant for the same, whenever it shall appear to him that the above sum has been so expended by the said Davis; and it shall hereafter be the duty of the state treasurer, annually, to pay from the bank tax and school fund, the proportion of the same to which the inhabitants of said islands may be entitled by their number of scholars, upon a return being made at the time, and in the manner required by law from incorporated towns, on the application of an agent of the inhabitants of said islands duly authorized to receive the same.
