Chapter 564.

An act to increase the capital stock of the People's Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The president, directors and company of the Peo- Capital stock Sect. 1. ples' Bank, at Waterville, are hereby authorized to increase the \$25,000. capital stock of said bank, by adding thereto the sum of twentyfive thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank in gold or silver, on or before the first day of October next, and to be Whon paid individed into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans shares, may be made by said bank on said additional capital, whenever the directors or a majority of them, together with the cashier, shall have signed and certified by oath, and filed in the office of the secretary of state, a certificate that said additional capital has been actually paid in.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 565.

An act to amend the charter of the Newichawanick Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The act approved March thirty-first, one thousand eight hun- Act amonded. dred and fifty-four, entitled "An act to incorporate the Newichawanick Company," is hereby so amended, that said company Rights and shall be authorized to manufacture goods from wool, cotton and privileges. flax, and to erect such buildings as may be useful for that purpose; and this act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
