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CHAP. 587.

Chapter 587.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Auburn Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Authorized to increase capital stock, \$25,000.

When paid in.

Shares \$100.

Loans, when to be made.

SECT. 1. The president, directors and company of the Auburn Bank, Auburn, at Danville, are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said bank, by adding thereto the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, to be paid into said bank in gold and silver, on or before the first Monday of October next, and to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and loans may be made by said bank on said additional capital, whenever the directors or a majority of them, with the cashier of said bank, shall have signed and verified by oath, and filed in the office of the secretary of state, a certificate that said addition of capital has been actually paid in.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 588.

An act to incorporate the Nezinscot Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Capital stock.

Shares.

SECT. 1. Nathan Morrill, Lucius Loring, Zadoc Long, Ephraim Atwood, Charles B. Atwood, America Farrar, Benjamin H. Cushman, Amory H. Allen, Samuel Thomes, Artemas F. Cole, George Bennett, James Spalding, Larnard Swallow, A. D. White, J. A. Gross, Ethie Farrar, Lorenzo Atwood, Virgil D. Parris, Noah Prince, J. W. Hines, Elisha Townsend, Lorenzo Buck, Ira Gardiner, Sullivan C. Andrews, their associates and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Nezinscot Bank.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and said bank shall be located in Buckfield, in the county of Oxford.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar corporations by the laws of this state, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor. CHAP. 589.

### Chapter 589.

An act to set off Stephen Spaulding, together with his real estate, from the town of Sumner to the town of Buckfield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. That Stephen Spaulding, together with his real estate hereinafter described, as follows, to wit: commencing at the south-east corner of Dana Town's land, on the town line between Buckfield and Sumner, and bounded on the west by land of said Town's and Charles Tucker, on the north by the North Pond, (so called) east by land of Stephen Ellis, America Bonney, Zaccheus Stevens, Daniel Russell, junior, and James Spaulding, on the south by land of N. B. Marston, and the present town line between Buckfield and Sumner, is hereby set off from the town of Sumner and annexed to the town of Buckfield.

Territory set off.

Boundaries.

SECT. 2. The said Stephen Spaulding shall pay to the inhabitants of Sumner all moneys legally assessed on his poll and estate remaining unpaid.

SECT. 3. This act shall be in force upon its approval by the governor.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. Jose Greely, B. Harrington, John P. McCurdy, T. Dinsmore, junior, Reuel H. Worthing, Hiram Worthing, Hartson Worthing, W. H. Worthing, Isaac L. Dow, Joseph E. Cary, George Estes, E. H. Bridgham, P. Dinsmore, Danford Parmenter, Joseph Parmenter, junior, B. French, Chandler Towle and Bracket Andrews, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the
