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CHAP. 594.**Chapter 594.**

An act to incorporate the Foxcroft Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Willard W. Harris, Joseph Kelsey, Silas Paul and Jonathan Roberts, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Foxcroft Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing goods and wares of iron, steel and wood of every description, at Foxcroft, in the county of Piscataquis; with power to sue and be sued, have and use a common seal, and have all the privileges and powers, and be subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements, granted or required, by the laws of this state.

Corporate name.

Purposes.

Powers and privileges.

Capital stock.

Shares.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

May purchase real estate. Amount.

SECT. 3. The said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding at any one time fifty thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. Any two of the persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, at such time and place as they may see fit, by giving notice of the same for two weeks successively in the Piscataquis Observer, a newspaper published in Dover, in the county of Piscataquis, for the purpose of organizing said corporation.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect upon its approval by the governor.

**Chapter 595.**

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Appropriations.

SECT. 1. In order to provide for certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury; and
