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CHAP. 598. City clerk, duty

SECT. 3. So much of the second section of the act to which this is additional, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. The provisions of this act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 598.

An act authorizing the construction of a wharf in the town of Camden.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. J. H. Eaton, E. M. Wood, Henry Knight and E. Cushing, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a wharf on land of said Eaton, in the town of Camden, county of Waldo, bordering on northerly shore of said Camden harbor, and extending into and over tide waters a sufficient distance to afford a depth of ten feet of water at low water, at lowest course of tides; said wharf not to exceed one hundred and fifty feet in width.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 599.

An act to incorporate the Brunswick Marble Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Daniel McCaine, David McCaine, Joseph Sawyer and M. A. Hodgdon, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Brunswick Marble Company, for the purpose of quarrying, working and manufacturing marble, iron, copper and other metals, mineral and stone, and preparing the same for market, in the county of Cumberland, and may purchase, hold and convey such real and personal estate as the business and transac-

May hold real and personal estate. tions of said company may require; with all the powers and CHAP. 600. privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities and requirements provided for similar corporations by the laws of this state. .....

Said Daniel McCaine shall have power to call the First meeting, SECT. 2. first meeting of said corporation, by giving each of the corporators notice in writing, at least five days before such meeting, of the time and place of holding the same, and also publishing the same two weeks successively in the Brunswick Telegraph, a newspaper printed in Brunswick, Cumberland county.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may at their first meeting, and May elect at all other meetings legally notified, elect seven directors, and other officers. such other officers as may be required for the business of the corporation; and may make such by-laws, rules and regulations By-laws, &c. as may be deemed necessary for the government of said corporation, and for conducting the affairs thereof, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state.

SECT. 4. Said corporation may sue and be sued by the name of the Brunswick Marble Company; may have a common seal, and may divide their capital stock into as many shares, and provide for the sale and transfer thereof, in such manner as they may deem expedient; but the amount of said capital stock Capital stock, shall never exceed one hundred thousand dollars. And said limited. company shall be located in the town of Brunswick.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:
